



AVOID A PAIN IN THE DRAIN

Greasy food waste is the leading cause of clogs in private sewer laterals and in the public wastewater system. Never rinse fats, oils, or grease down the drain (including oily dressings, mayonnaise, and gravy).

HAVE SMALL AMOUNTS OF GREASE?

Paper towels used to wipe fats and grease can go in your green organics cart.

HAVE LARGE AMOUNTS OF GREASE?

- **Dublin Residents:** Large amounts of used cooking oil should be collected in a plastic bottle with a resealable cap and dropped off at a collection facility. Find one near you at resource.stopwaste.org
- **San Ramon Residents:** Cooking oil must be contained in a 1-gallon or smaller sealed screw-top container. Place the container next to (but not inside) your blue recycling cart. Request an oil jug from ACI of San Ramon at sanramonrecycles.com



TRASH WIPES, NOT PIPES!

Did you know most wet wipes labeled “flushable” actually shouldn’t be flushed? They may disappear from your toilet bowl, but many types of so-called “flushable” wipes can cause sewer backups at your home, leading to costly plumbing repairs.

Remember next time you use a wet wipe, they belong in the trash—not your toilet.
